Braw Snaw!

This forest is very good at holding snow. Tall trees provide shade which slows the snowmelt, making it ideal for **Nordic or cross-country skiing**. British Olympic skiers and sled-dog teams train here. The trails are designed for skiers but when the snow melts, they're ideal for walkers, mountain bikers and horse-riders.

Winter Work

Local Ski Club volunteers level and compact the snow, and create 'tramlines' for skiers. **During the skiing season, please don't step or ride in the tramlines and watch out for working machinery.**

Woodland home, wood for homes

Clashindarroch, Aberdeenshire's biggest forest, is a sustainable source of timber. It's also a great place for wildlife. Look out for red deer, red squirrels and woodland birds among the larch, spruce & Scots pine.

Clais an darach means the furrow or the valley of the oaks in Gaelic

Trailblazing

Numbered signposts with maps help you find your way. Surfaces are good but some trails are steep in places.

Anyone can ski here and it's a great place to try it out. Huntly Nordic and Outdoor Centre runs ski courses and provides ski hire. Huntly Nordic Ski Club organises ski events for all abilities.
